Winter Meeting 2017

LAS VEGAS—It is official. The 2017 AHR Expo is the largest in the Show's history in terms of attendance, as well as physical size.

"This is by far the biggest Show we've ever done," Clay Stevens, president of International Exposition Co., Show manager and producer.

But what does it mean to have the biggest Show ever? If the nearly 70,000 visitors and exhibitors walked up and down every aisle, they will have gone more than 8 miles.

The previous record-holder for the AHR Expo with the highest attendance was the 2014 Show in New York. However, Stevens told Show Daily that, preregistered attendance here in Las Vegas even before the Show

was among those visitors and I can assure you that the men's bathroom lines were long. The event was very successful and opened my eyes to many new products and systems introduced. With the recent EPA SNAP refrigerants ruling, many manufacturers introduced new ways of being energy efficient and reducing the global warming potential of any refrigerant leaks. I hope you consider going to the semi-annual winter meeting in Chicago 2018.

The ASHRAE Summer meeting will be held in Long Beach California this year. It isn't too early to start making plans to hit the beach!

And finally, just a reminder about the new program we are introducing. The chapter would like to pay for the cost of future chapter leaders to attend this event. The Spring 2017 YEA Leadership Weekend will be held in Denver, CO from March 3-5, 2017. Stevens noted that it isn't only location that are attracting visitors to the Show. "We've been here (Las Vegas) before, and the numbers are a great deal higher than in 2011, when we were here [in Las Vegas] the last time."

"However, I don't discount Las Vegas. Las Vegas is a popular place."

What really attracts visitors, says Stevens, is the Show itself. AHR Expo has long been the place where HVAC&R professionals can see the latest and most innovative products and technologies. "That hasn't changed a lot—It's just that this (2017) show has more of it." Specifically, Stevens noted "the whole energy issue, the whole idea of efficiency" is something attendees always look for at the Show. And, they can find it throughout the gamut of the Show's exhibits.

Because of the vast size and scope of the Show, Stevens suggests that attendees, rather than trying to just wander around, plan to focus on specific things of interest. "If they didn't," he said "They're gonna have some sore feet!"

As reported in yesterday's Show Daily, total space occupied by exhibitors in the three halls of the Las Vegas Convention Center, was the largest ever. Slightly more than 500,000 ft2 of space is occupied for this Show. Stevens says that he doubts that any attendee could actually walk the entire show floor in three days. "It's way too much ground to cover without any direction."

To give attendees some needed direction, the Show floor is organized. For example, Building Automation and Controls exhibitors are grouped together in a single section. This niche of the industry is one where Stevens says he has seen the most growth over the years. Expansion of existing technologies is an area that Stevens says has tracked, and contributed to the growth of the Show.

To help attendees narrow their focus, and make the large Show more manageable, Stevens suggests using the Show's website (ahrexpo.com), as well as the Show's mobile app. Their included search functions enable users to find exactly what they are looking for.

"You can put together your own itinerary." This, he says, will give attendees "a fairly 'efficient' way to walk the Show and find the exhibitors showing the products one wants to see." The same, he says, applies to the numerous education sessions being offered at the Show.



5 Easy Steps to Earn and Maintain an ASHRAE Certification

1. Read the Candidate Guidebook

Visit www.ashrae.org/certification and download the guidebook for the program in which you are interested.

2. Complete the Application

Complete the online application at www.ashrae.org/certification. Membership in ASHRAE is not a requirement for certification.

3. Schedule an Examination

BCxP, BEAP, BEMP, HBDP, HFDP and OPMP examinations are offered at over 300 conveniently located computer-based testing centers worldwide. Candidates may schedule an examination appointment online or by telephone.

4. Review Available Resources

The Candidate Guidebook for a program identifies available resources, including practice exams, that may help candidates gain an understanding of the body of knowledge that the examination tests. Purchase of books or course registrations is not a prerequisite to taking any ASHRAE certification examination.

5. Renew the Certification

Each certification is renewable every three years. To retain certification, each certification holder must earn 45° Professional Development Hours (PDHs) during the three year period following initial certification or the last renewal.
